#### **Updates:**

- IUP is exploring the possible development of a college of osteopathic medicine. If successful, it will be the first medical school of its kind at a public university in Pennsylvania.
- Beginning in the fall of 2023, each IUP student is assigned a Navigator for help with anything from academic support to everyday campus life. Following the first year of the Navigators program, IUP's first- to second-year retention rate rose more than four percentage points to 75.3 percent.
